

The stage becomes fluid as Andrea Haenggi with her company AMDaT mix live feeds from hidden cameras with stunning projected films that are layered over dynamic, serene yet brutal live dance. Haenggi promises to once again explode artistic boundaries with her unique vision of dance, visual art and technology in this provocative premiere. She collaborates with sound composer David Linton, costume designer Karen Young and lighting designer Roderick Murray.

AMDaT, a New York-based Dance Company led by Swiss born choreographer/visual artist Andrea Haenggi, creates live performances of visual motion constructions: site-specific dance video installations and multi-media stage works that combine contemporary dance with visual art, prosaic architecture and technology. The Company challenges and engages its audience in rich, thought-provoking aesthetic experiences and aims to transform peoples' perception of everyday life. The company recently premiered the evening-length work escalator in the lobbies of the World Financial Center complex and performed its critically acclaimed dance video installation under whose control at the TSEH Russian Dance Platform in Moscow.
